PROGRAM

Carol Shipley, executive director of the Stanislaus Family Justice Center, provided a very interesting update on what is happening with the organization which aids adults and children who are victims of domestic violence and abuse.

The center opened in 2010 and now collaborates with a number of other non-profits to help victims and offenders. The goal is to break the cycle of violence, and that can only be achieved by working with all sides.

The center is now located at 1418 I St., in what many remember as the original home of Valley Sporting Goods. There is a video conferencing set-up so victims can testify from the safety of the center. And there is a Kids Zone for children to play and get food while their parent is getting assistance elsewhere in the building. The goal is to offer a path to safety, not just through immediate aid but long-term counseling and mental health treatment.

She said the people talking with clients try to find out the whole story, not just the recent incidents that prompted the person to seek help. In many cases, the adult has experienced trauma dating to their childhood.

The center participates in Camp Hope, which gives younger children (7-11) and older kids (12-18) a chance to experience a week of fun and confidence-building adventure.

She invited Kiwanians to match the efforts of local Lions Clubs, which have several leaves on the center's Donor Tree. And she invited people to attend the McHenry Bowl's 18th annual Benefit Bowl, which this year will benefit the Stanislaus Family Justice Center. It will be Aug. 4.

Finally, she recommended a new book, "Hope Rising: How the Science of HOPE Can Change Your Life" by Casey Gwinn and Chan Hellman. It is due out in November.
