PROGRAM - all car show

Charlie Christensen re the parade – information for those working along the route:

Those on the **late shift** need to stay until the trash is picked up and the police reopen the street. Once the crowd disperses, pull out the garbage bag and tie the top. If the garbage can gets filled during the parade, there are extra bags in the bottom. When the garbage crew arrives, one crew will grab the tied off garbage bags and the other the cans. (We have 94 of them!)

Early shift: Once you arrive, look for the street markings. X = the place to put the barricade, --= a place where caution tape will go and 0= the place for the intersection monitor to stand/sit. You want to let people out of the businesses but urge them to find the nearest street to exit. During the parade: If a car is overheating or has another problem, the driver can pull off the street and can pull back on if his/her problem is resolved.

Everyone: Intersection monitors will want to bring a chair and probably an ice chest, although they'll be offered bottled water every so often.

Ray Sanders said the police have been fantastic to work with. If a volunteer has a problem with a spectator or someone, don't get into it with the person. Simply wave over one of the police officers and ask them to resolve it.

Brent re the parade: There will be two special cars (among the many special cars): Dennis Wallace's car has been restored/decorated in his memory and will be driven by Mercedes and Dave Wallace. Here's what it looks like now:





Also, Faith Grainger, who made the hot rod movie "Deuce of Spades," will be bringing her vehicle (roadster) and will be in the parade and at the show.

Judy Herrero had the right number but pulled a white marble. Skipper Friecke won the lunch money (again).


SPECIAL SURPRISE
