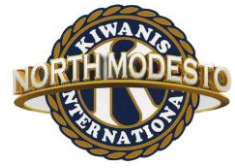

ANNOUNCEMENTS

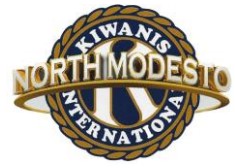
