#### **PROGRAM**

We had an interesting and lively program from Becky Crow, the CEO of the Veterans Foundation of Stanislaus County. Becky, a U.S. Air Force veteran of the Vietnam War, talked about the creation of a Veterans' Advisory Commission, which in turn led to the creation of the foundation and now the establishment of the Stanislaus Veterans Center.

The foundation, a 501c3 was born in 2015, and is working with Stanislaus County and the city of Modesto for the operation of a one-stop shop that will house veterans services, five government agencies that assist veterans and 31 separate veterans-related organizations.

The 37,500-square-foot center is nearly complete in the shopping center at 3500 Coffee Road. The grand opening is set for April 21 from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m.



Becky shared brochures about naming opportunities and invited the Kiwanis Clubs to get together to sponsor a room.

The hope, she said, is that the center will bring scattered services together so that veterans of all ages can meet and learn what is available to them. There will be a 300-seat banquet room, with a lounge (Jeremiah Williams is building the bar!) and conference rooms of various sizes. As well as room naming opportunities, there also a campaign to finish the patio by having people buy patio pavers. Prices are \$100 or \$250, depending on the size.

The theme of the whole effort is "Bringing Veterans Together."
