Ken Nolte was happy to have survived a dog attack and appreciated the support of his fellow Kiwanians through the ordeal.



PROGRAM

Linda and Alan Cover provided a very interesting program about the Wood Colony area, its history and what makes it so special and so well suited for farming. Wood Colony was in the spotlight a couple of years ago when the then-mayor proposed that it should be part of the city plan as a location for business and industry.

Linda shared the history of Wood Colony, especially the Old German Baptist families who settled there in the early 1900s. Alan and Linda's granddaughters are the sixth generation of Covers to live on their



farm. Not far away, at "happy corners" is what is believed to be the oldest walnut tree in California and maybe in the world.

Alan, a retired ag instructor at MJC, said Wood Colony has several qualities that make it unique, including its dirt -- a mix of sand, silt and clay – that is so good for crops and the availability of water (the water table initially was too high for trees).

The area has more traffic these days because commuters have identified those roads as a faster way to get to the Bay Area. Like other farmers, those in Wood Colony have to deal with a frustrating amount of government regulation, Alan said. He considers farmers the first and best environmentalists because they need and value the land, water and air. "I've got skin in the game," Alan said

He closed by asking Kiwanians to support Wood Colony remaining as it has been for the last 100 years plus.
