Joe said the ceremony was remarkably moving and is very glad they made the trip. While tourists can visit the cemeteries and beaches any time, observances such as this are held every 5 years.

Jeremiah Williams presented Joe with a check for \$2,000 for Royal Family Kids Camp, an annual program for foster children. Joe invited everyone to the Jan. 10 concert benefitting the camp.
