Steve Collins reported that Linda's hip surgery was complicated but successful. She likely will go into rehab after leaving the hospital.


Bob Dunbar is happy to have broken 100 golfing for the first time since his health problems.

PROGRAM

Pete Vella introduced Cheryl Schrock, senior walk manager for the Alzheimer's Association in our region, and Scott Kramling, a longtime friend and a volunteer with the association.

Cheryl was introduced to the association when her father was diagnosed with the disease eight years ago and it was hugely helpful to her whole family. She has worked for the association for four years.

Cheryl noted that Alzheimer's is one of the most common causes of death in the U.S. (now No. 2 in California) and the only one for which there is no cure or effective treatments. She is passionate about "making noise" to get funding for research, better diagnoses, etc. We don't have enough trained professionals or facilities and the tsunami will hit about 2025 as the boomers continue to age, Cheryl warned.



Scott talked about his family's experience and what prompted him to volunteer with the association. His father died just last month from the disease. The association sponsors an annual Walk to End Alzheimer's. The 2019 event in Modesto will be Sept. 7 starting at Graceada Park.

After the meeting, Scott shared this info:

For the walk, there are 2 ways individual Kiwanis members can support the Alzheimer's Association Modesto Walk to End Alzheimer's.
